#### SNS 00078-224 (87116-197) "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAS THOU FORSAKEN ME?"

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## INTRODUCTION.

- A. Scripture text: Matthew 27:45-50.
- B. This is the third in a sermon series on the sayings of Jesus while on the cross. Jesus said seven very important things while being crucified and they deserve our study.
- C. This series will continue next Sunday night, Lord willing.
- D. The seven sayings are:
  - 1. "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing" (Lk. 23:34).
  - 2. "Truly I say to you, today you shall be with Me in Paradise" (Lk. 23:43).
  - 3. "Woman, behold, your son!" **27** Then He said<sup>^</sup> to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" (Jn. 19:26-27)
  - 4. "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAST THOU FORSAKEN ME?" (Mt. 27:46).
  - 5. "I am thirsty" (Jn. 19:28).
  - 6. "It is finished!" (Jn. 19:30).
  - 7. "Father, INTO THY HANDS I COMMIT MY SPIRIT" (Lk. 23:46).
- E. Tonight's lesson comes from Mt. 27:46: "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAST THOU FORSAKEN ME?"

## 1. THIS SAYING IS JESUS QUOTING SCRIPTURE.

- A. Scripture texts: Mt. 27:46; Psa. 22:1-18.
- B. Jesus is quoting from the Psalms when He utters this saying. All of the 22nd Psalm is fitting for speaking about the overcoming of enemies.
- C. Jesus handled crisis situations with scripture (see Mt. 4). This is no different.
- D. Psalm 22 is most prophetic and instructional in viewing the crucifixion. Some points to consider:
  - 1. God is the deliverer (22:1-5).
  - 2. God delivers sinners (22:6-8).
  - 3. Troubles are everywhere (22:11-15).
    - a. The apostles except John have fled.
    - b. J must die.
    - c. The Jews have rejected the X.
  - 4. The prophecy of X's death (22:16-18).

# II. THE REAL NATURE OF SIN IS SEEN IN JESUS' STATEMENT.

- A. Sin means separation from God (Isa. 59:1-2). Behold, the LORD'S hand is not so short That it cannot save; Neither is His ear so dull That it cannot hear. 2 But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, And your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He does not hear.
- B. There is hardship, agony, and pain for the sinner (transgressor), see Prov. 13:15. Good understanding produces favor, But the way of the treacherous is hard.
- C. The Gentiles (non-covenant people) have no hope, separated, excluded, and strangers to the covenant (Eph. 2:1).

And you were dead in your trespasses and sins,...

D. Ex.: Story of girl lost in a forests running faster and faster due to being scared. She is unknowingly being cut by the trees and bushes because of her fright of being lost.

# III. MAN'S CONDITION AND GOD'S ANSWER.

All men are lost without X (Rom. 3:10, 23; Ac. 4:12; 2Th. 1:8).
 (Ac 4:12) "And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men, by which we must be saved."

(**Rom 3:10, 23**) ...as it is written, "THERE IS NONE RIGHTEOUS, NOT EVEN ONE;" [23] for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,...

(2Th 1:8) ...dealing out retribution to those who do not know God and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus.

- B. If only all man and women could come to a knowledge and understanding of the gravity of sin as X did while on the cross!
- C. The answer to X's question did not come immediately. Usually, the more difficult the problem--the longer in coming is the answer.
- D. The answer is that God did forsake X, while He was on the cross because J has become sin on our behalf (2Cor. 5:21).
  He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.
- E. But on the third day God raised Jesus from the dead. The answer is found in Mt. 28:6. "He is not here, for He has risen, just as He said. Come, see the place where He was lying."
- F. We serve a risen Savior (Rev. 1:18). ...and the living One; and I was dead, and behold, I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of death and of Hades.

#### CONCLUSION AND INVITATION.

- A. We must come to grips with our own sin. We must know of the separation that we have with God because of sin. We cannot rationalize it away.
- B. This saying of Jesus should show us the true nature of sin and how it breaks fellowship with God.
- C. But also realize that Jesus became sin on our behalf that we might become the righteousness of God in Him (2Cor. 5:21).
- D. Jesus died so that we can overcome the sin, He so keenly felt.
- E. Plan of salvation for non-Xians, erring-Xians.
