INTRODUCTION.

- A. Scripture text: Hebrews 3:7-12.
- B. From Roy Enoch.
- C. The children of Israel were God's people under the first covenant and were often a backsliding people:
 - 1. In the wilderness at Sinai, the ten spies "melted their hearts."
 - 2. In the land of Canaan during the Judges, they turned from the Lord repeatedly.
 - 3. Under the divided kingdom, they constantly left the Lord (Jer. 2:19).
- D. Only two of the 603,550 men; 20 years and older, not counting the Levites; entered Canaan.
 - 1. They had provoked God with their rebellion through unbelief (Num. 14:2,4).
 - 2. Therefore, they failed to enter into God's rest in Canaan because of unbelief (Heb. 3:11).
- E. Paul also used this same example of the Israelites as a warning to Xians (1Cor. 10: 1-12).

MEN LEAVE GOD FOR MANY DIFFERENT REASONS.

- A. Some, like the Israelites, leave God because of unbelief:
 - 1. They had enough faith to do what God said to be freed from Egyptian bondage. But didn't have enough faith to keep them in the trials/tests of the wilderness (Heb. 3:19).
 - a. The people lost faith because of the false report of 10 of the spies (Num. 13:25-33).
 - b. They did not have confidence that God would give them Canaan.
 - 2. The Xian faith is still under attack:
 - a. Atheistic Humanism causes many to leave the faith.
 - b. Liberalism (denial that the Bible is the word of God) causes many to do as they please.
 - 3. Yet, in spite "of the attacks, God's word still lives and works for those who trust it enough to do what it says (Rom. 1:16):
 - Man's unbelief and disobedience can no more nullify God's word now than in the days of Moses (Heb. 3:11-12).
 - God's word is still a discerner of man's heart, even though man does not discern the word of God.
 - 4. The glory of man is short-lived:
 - a. Those ten spies caused the hearts of the people to melt, but they died and God's word proved true under Joshua.
 - b. Critics still scoff at the word of God, but it will outlast them all.
- B. A lack of daily exhortation can cause men to depart from God (Heb. 3:13).
 - 1. It is still possible for people to become discouraged in trying to live the Xian life (Heb. 10:36)
 - 2. Brethren have a responsibility toward one another. Yes, we are our brother's keeper (Gal. 6:1; Jas. 5:19-20).
 - 3. Xians should be more active in a daily exhortation. Encouragement is needed when:
 - a. One is sick.

d. A student is in college.

b. Death comes.

- e. A person is a new Xian.
- c. A financial tragedy hits.
- f. Everyone is in worship (Col. 3:16).
- C. The deceitful of sin can cause God's people to leave Him (Heb. 3:13).
 - 1. Sin is a deceiver, and distorts spiritual vision (Eph. 4:22).
 - 2. The sin of neglect is subtle and deceptive (Jas. 4: 17).
 - 3. Sin promises men what it does not give (happiness and security), and then gives what it did not promise--death (Rom. 6:23).

II. MANY SIGNS SHOW THE HEART OF UNBELIEF.

A. One sign of unbelief is neglecting salvation:

- 1. "Neglect" means a lack of concern that reveals indifference.
- 2. An indifferent attitude toward spiritual needs/responsibilities shows a lack of real faith.
- B. Another sign of unbelief is the failure to become a teacher of the word of God (Heb. 5:12):
 - 1. Not everyone can effectively teach a class, but we can teach and encourage friends and those we come in contact with.
 - 2. We must trust that the soul is more valuable that the rest of the world (Mt. 16:26).
 - 3. Xians need the firm conviction that God's word can save (Jas. 1:21).
 - 4. We must all see the need to become teachers of the word (1Pet. 3:15).
- C. Another sign of unbelief is forsaking the assembly of the saints (Heb. 10:25).
 - 1. Those who really believe the Lord will honor His command (Lk. 22:19).
 - a. The Lord said to eat the Lord's Supper in His memory.
 - b. This was one of the purposes of assembling each first day of the week (Ac. 20:7).
 - 2. A refusal to worship the Lord clearly reveals an "evil heart of unbelief."

CONCLUSION AND INVITATION.

- A. The NT does not speak of the "possibility of apostasy" but the reality of the danger of it.
- B. One can "take heed lest he fall" (1Cor. 10:12).
- C. One must guard his heart carefully because that is where sin starts (Mt. 15:18-20).
 - 1. Ananias and Sapphira had heart trouble (Ac. 5:4).
 - 2. Simon the sorcerer had a problem in his heart (Ac. 8:22).
- D. We can be faithful to God and not draw back to perdition (Heb. 10:39).
- E. Plan of salvation for non-Xians, erring Xians.
