#### INTRODUCTION.

- A. Scripture text: 1Peter 1:3-9.
- B. The Hebrew writer says that our hope is to be an anchor for the soul. Our hope is to be sure and steadfast.
- C. In the storms and uncertainties of life, our hope as Christians is to be that which stabilizes us.
- D. Because we have been born again we have a living hope that is strong and sure. Peter discusses our living hope in detail.

## I. A LIVING HOPE.

- A. The resurrection of X has given us a living hope, in which we are saved (Rom. 8:24).
- B. If we hope to get to heaven, then we will:
  - 1. Desire it (have deeds worthy).
  - 2. Expect it (confidence according to 1Jn. 5:13).
- C. Our living hope brings an inheritance that is nothing less than indescribable (1:4):
  - Incorruptible (never perish; NIV, imperishable; NAS).
    Nothing unclean will ever enter the true church (Rev. 21:27).
  - 2. Undefiled (never spoil; NIV).

No idol worship, polluted sacrifices, unclean temple. No sin in the city (Rev. 21:8).

3. Fades not away (never fade; NIV).

The old Law faded away due to being fulfilled. But Heaven never fades in glory. See 2Cor. 3:7, 13; Heb. 8:13.

4. Reserved in heaven for you (kept; NIV).

The true promised land for believers today. See Phil. 3:20.

D. Our desire and expectation is not in vain! We have a living hope!

# II. SECURED BY GOD HIMSELF.

A. **Protected by God** (1:5).

This means to be guarded or shielded. It is a military term that emphasizes a soldier looking out for us continually.

B. **Prepared by God** (1:6-7).

Trials and suffering are preparing us for a greater faith. God is able to use our sufferings and problems to our benefit!

C. Purchased by God in Christ (1:8-9).

We are to:

Love Christ.

3. Rejoice in Christ.

2. Trust Christ.

- 4. Be saved in Christ.
- D. **Prophesied by God** (1:10-12).
  - 1. The worked in our behalf.
  - 2. They wanted to know who and when.
  - 3. They wanted to know of glory that would follow (resurrection and/or church).
  - 4. Serving us, and not themselves.
  - 5. Things which the angels desire to know.
- E. Our desire and expectation is not in vain! We have a living hope!

## III. "...WHAT SORT OF PEOPLE OUGHT YOU TO BE..."

A. Peter says to show fear or great reverence for God (1:17).

Let us be fearful of disappointing God by not living faithful! Reverence is a healthy fear.

### B. Therefore:

1. Gird your minds for action (1:13).

Get busy in the church. Find things to do that bring honor and glory to God. Start dreaming and praying (Eph. 3:20-21).

2. **Be sober** (1:13).

Be calm, steady, and controlled. Weigh matters before you act. God is sitting on His throne in complete control--let's start acting like it!

3. Fix your hope on God's grace (1:13).

God's grace is always sufficient--so trust in it (2Cor. 12:9). God's grace can enable (empower) you, to do what is necessary.

4. As (be) obedient children (1:14).

To be obedient is--to listen, to submit, and to trust.

Before we became Christians, we were children of disobedience (Eph. 2:1-3).

5. Not conformed to former lusts (1:14).

Ignorance leads to indulgence.

When you do not know what is right, you will begin doing what is wrong.

6. Be holy in your behavior (1:15).

Holiness is part of God's nature, or character.

Holiness, therefore, should be part of our new character, since we are chosen of Him.

C. Our desire and expectation is not in vain! We are to be living our hope!
